

request I replaced the handcuff on Hanson's left wrist with a soft "posy" restraint so that a blood pressure cuff could be placed on his left arm. .

Shortly after arriving at the hospital I heard hospital staff state that Hanson had "coded" and started CPR. I contacted Mst. Sgt. Smith from the hospital and advised him of the situation. I asked Mst. Sgt. Smith if he wanted a detective called out as it appeared Hanson would not survive. Mst. Sgt. Smith advised to have patrol investigate the case.

I spoke briefly with Hanson's physician Dr. Kahn. Dr. Kahn stated that she had spoken to Hanson's father and informed him that Hanson's condition was critical. Dr. Kahn stated that she would notify Hanson's parents as to his condition. Medical personnel advised me that it did not appear they would be able to revive Hanson but were continuing CPR when I left the hospital at approximately 2314 hours.

Officer Evans picked me up at RVMC and transported me back to Ashland. While en route to Ashland I experienced increasing pain in my left shoulder and ribs. I went to Ashland Community Hospital and was examined by Dr. Henderson. It was determined that I had bruised my ribs and shoulder and possibly damaged the rotator cuff in my left shoulder when trying to force entry into the house.

While at ACH I learned that Hanson had died. Sgt. Williams advised me that the MADIU team had been activated and Det. Hobbs would be the lead investigator. I returned to the Ashland Police Department where I was interviewed by Det. Hobbs, Det. Young and Det Jensen, Ofc. Wesel and I accompanied the detectives to Hanson's apartment at their request I was released to secure at approximately 0445 hours.

ACTION RECOMMENDED

Forward a copy of this report to Det. Hobbs. Investigation discontinued for this officer.
