

yelled, "Why the fuck did you Tase' me, why didn't you fucking shoot me, why didn't you fucking shoot me, shoot me." Sgt. Selby holstered her pistol and grabbed Hanson's legs by his pants, I grabbed the Taser from Officer Schuster and Officer Schuster grabbed one of Hanson's arms. Hanson continued to resist when officers tried to handcuff him and Officer Schuster stated we would Tase' him again if he didn't comply. Hanson said, "Don't Tase' me." Officer Schuster and Sgt. Selby were then able to place handcuffs on Hanson. At no time did officers lay or lean on Hanson to restrain him. \* see pg 14

Sgt. Selby began a cursory search for weapons and means of escape. She was unable to hold Hanson up right and search his other side so Officer Schuster searched the other side. Hanson was then leaned up against the refrigerator in a seated position on the floor. He was unable to hold himself up so Officer Schuster held him by his arm.

I noticed a light blue thick substance on the kitchen counter, in the cup I had seen him drinking. from and on the floor where he had fallen. Hanson began to spit small amounts of the same colored substance. Sgt. Selby told dispatch to send AFR in but I didn't hear dispatch respond back so I advised dispatch to send AFR "Code 3." *discrepancy See pg 3*

I noticed on the coffee table a small bottle of "Crest" mouth wash, but the consistency was thinner than the substance in the cup. I noticed on the kitchen counter a bottle of dish soap but it was bright green. I noticed in the pantry of the kitchen a bottle of window cleaner but again it was the wrong consistency.

Hanson was continuing to talk although I don't know what he was saying. At this time Sgt. Williams appeared on scene as did two AFR paramedics. Dispatch advised Hanson's father was still on the cell phone and could only hear loud noises. I turned around and saw Sgt. Williams grab the phone from the floor and begin talking; I did not hear the conversation. Refer to Sgt. Williams report for further details. I also saw Officer Vanderlip had arrived on scene; refer to his report for his details. 2

I advised AFR of the substance and stated we didn't know what it was. One paramedic began to ask Hanson what he had taken while another paramedic was bent down holding Hanson's head up. I heard Hanson say, "Four bottles" and I was unclear what else he said. I heard one paramedic say something, like "How many did you take?" Hanson stated something to the effect of "Sorry I don't have the exact number." The paramedics located some empty bottles of "Unisom" in the trash can next to the refrigerator. I saw multiple bottles but did not see an exact amount. They also located some prescription bottles from atop the refrigerator but I didn't see, what type of medication it was nor do I know how many. I did hear someone advise Hanson has seizures but I didn't hear how that information was obtained. !

Some discussion of AFR taking Hanson to RVMC began and Hanson stated, "I don't want to go in the ambulance it costs too much." Soon after I heard the paramedic that was standing tell Hanson he was going to go in the back of the patrol car. Sgt. Selby stated "No he will be going in an ambulance." Officer Schuster said, "You 'took too many pills to go with us."

Officer Schuster knelt down next to Hanson and the paramedic and asked if they could get a gurney. The paramedic let go of Hanson and returned with a gurney. It was decided there was more room in the living room to be able to get Hanson on the gurney so Sgt. Selby and Officer Schuster lifted Hanson up and moved him to the living room floor. I then removed the Taser cartridge from the
